



Mountainous and bisected by coastal ranges, California's Central Coast is an enchanted place. Broken by a few large valleys and the narrow coastal shelf, the land is primarily made up of sandstones, shales and conglomerates with inter-bedded volcanic rock. Sea breezes, fogs and a prevailing onshore maritime airflow temper the climate. The parental influences of the topography, soils and climates lend themselves to the creation of enchanting, food-friendly wines such as this Syrah.
